## **Directions**

Thank you for your interest in adopting/fostering a dog from Pets Stop Here Rescue. In order to complete your application we need a few things from you. Please contact me every time you finish a part of the process.

#### Part 1: Contact Vet

- Please be sure to contact the vet immediately and tell them to disclose information to anyone from Pets Stop Here Rescue.

### Part 2: Contact References

- Please get us the emails of the references listed if you did not put them in the original application. You MUST have 2 references in order to proceed.

### Part 3: Home Check

To do this you will have to do 5 <u>DIFFERENT</u> videos. *It can not* be one large video and must be 5 different videos in order to send to us via email or text.

## 1. Start outside

- a. Show the front street/neighborhood view- state the speed limit, type of street, neighborhood characteristics (a lot of dogs in neighborhood, a lot of kids, etc)
  - i. How will the dog get exercise daily?
- b. Go outback and walk the fence line- We must be able to see the fence well from start to end. If it's hard to see mention what type of fence each part is and approximate height
  - i. Show the yard and also how the dog will get outback
  - ii. Are there other dogs on other sides of the fence? make note of which sides, how many, and how they act.
- 2. Go into the garage, only if the dog can get in by itself somehow, make note of how you get into the garage from the house
  - a. Looking to make sure there is nothing toxic at dog level that it could get into

- 3. Walk the first floor of your house showing every room slowly
  - a. Quickly introduce all pets in house at some point during the walk through

# b. Make note of the following

- i. Where will each dog eat? (They should be split a good distance)
- ii. Are you against crate training/how well do you know crate training? Where will the crate be? (Must Benoit of direct sunlight and vents)
- iii. Can the dog be on furniture?
- iv. Where will the dog sleep at night?
- v. Where will the dog be when left alone during day?

## 4. Walk down to the basement

- a. If there is a door leading down- Will it remain shut at all times so the dog can't get down there alone? - if there is no door think about using a baby gate to keep the dog from going down there
- b. Show the basement making note of anything at dog level
  - Mainly looking for small things and hazardous things (detergent, soaps, etc) at dog level that they can get into

## 5. Walk upstairs and show the upstairs rooms

- a. If there is a door leading up- Will it remain shut at all times so the dog can't go up there alone? - if no door think about using a baby gate to keep the dog from going up there
- b. Think about the fact that the dog could get up there and when not in eyesight may go to the bathroom
